



### **Directions to City Club:**

NOTE: The directions are the same whether you are headed either North or South.

From I-35W, take exit 52A to enter Spur 280 toward downtown Fort Worth. (This is a right-hand exit from either direction.) Bear right onto 4th Street. Go just past the Bass Hall, then turn right on Commerce Street. Go one block and turn right on 3rd Street. Go one block and turn right on Calhoun Street. Enter the parking garage on your left via the last entrance. After parking, find the elevator at the northwest corner of the garage. Take the elevator (if necessary) to Level 3 BLUE. Walk across two sky-bridges to the DR Horton Tower. Keep bearing right until you come to Sherry's Gifts and Snacks. Turn left and find 4 elevators marked "3-12". Go to the 4th floor (City Club Meeting Rooms). On the 4th floor, follow the signs to the Mercedes Club Dinner.

Our Fall Overnighter event will take us to Paris, TX, a unique city of over 25,000 people northeast of the Metroplex. Paris, named after the beautiful City of Light, is a city rich in history and tradition. We have planned a full weekend of activities. On Saturday, we plan to visit the Lamar County Historical Museum and Confederate General Maxey's restored house, attend the downtown open house at the Plaza (the city will also light up their Christmas tree on this day). After dinner, we will have a private wine tasting at the Carriage House Jewelry and Gift Shop Downtown, then proceed to the hotel for our social. 

### Prior Event Report - Park Place Bodywerks Fort Worth Tour (and Lunch), September 20, 2014

Twenty-two members in 14 cars participated in a private tour of the brand-new Park Place Bodywerks Fort Worth location. The tour was conducted by General Manager David Norris.

David opened the session explaining why a certified body shop should be the preferred choice for our Mercedes cars, especially those equipped with adaptive lighting systems, Distronic radar cruise control, electronic driver aids and other equipment which could be damaged due to a collision.

The tour included an example of a bad repair from another body shop, which his shop is now tasked to correct at the car owner's request. We saw the proper repair of a Mercedes frame rail, and how the shop intends to repair damage from a bad side collision. Our next stop was the paint booth, where a technician was actually painting a car during our tour. Also included was an explanation of how the foolproof Celette Bench system worked. The bench uses fixtures and jigs specific to the car model to accurately measure frame damage, and then the damage is fixed to get the car back to manufacturer's specifications.

After the tour, most of us opted to enjoy a group lunch at Cooper's BBQ at the Fort Worth Stockyards. To get there, we drove through the heart of the city, passing by some nice Fort Worth neighborhoods, TCU, Trinity Park, the Fort Worth Zoo, Downtown, and the Stockyards.

### Prior Event Report - Track Day 2014, Texas Motorsport Ranch, Cresson, TX, October 4, 2014

Over 30 beautiful cars from the Mercedes and Ferrari clubs converged at the Motorsport Ranch in Cresson for an afternoon on the track. Club members took the opportunity to give their Mercedes, Ferrari, Audi, BMW, or Jaguar a chance to flex their muscles in a controlled environment, and to improve their driving skills. A number of club members, who did not wish to drive on the track, came as spectators to find out if they would like to give it a try next time.

The event started with a safety and introduction class taught by Jack Farr, the founder of Motorsport Ranch, the original sports car country club. We then proceeded to the track for our first lead-and-follow session - four groups each following a pace car. Members who did not drive had a chance to experience the track as passengers. A second classroom session followed, then we got on the track again for another pace car session.

After another classroom session, we were let loose on the track by ourselves. We broke up into "fast" and "faster" groups. This time we were allowed to pass on the straightaways. The instructors communicated constantly with the drivers via our standard FM radios. More solo sessions followed after breaks to let our cars cool down.

After a full afternoon, we went home satisfied that we made the most of this splendid day on the track.
